On behalf of local organizing committee, I would like to invite the elite ultrarunners from over the world to take part in 2023 IAU 24H World Championship which will be held at Taipei, Taiwan on December 1.

I introduced the ultrarunning sport to Taiwan 25 years ago. I started to organize a 100K race on the highway in 1998. Since 1999, the Soochow 24 H race was held almost every year, the race has been organized for 20 years and become one of the prestigious 24h races in the world. Many world records, continental records and country records were established in the race. Many committee members are involved in the organizing of the coming World Championship race.

Taiwan is famous of its innovation of semiconductors and biotechnologies, but the sustainable development for sports is also valued. We, the Chinese Taipei Association of Ultrarunners, regulated the Carbon Foot Print- Category Product Rule: running events which has been approved by the Department of Environment Protection of government in 2022, since then we can calculate the quantity of CO2e we produced in a running race. 6 IAU 24H WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

Competition

IAU World 24H Championships have 4 competitions:

- A. Men's individual Competition
- **B.** Women's individual Competition
- C. Men's Team Competition
- D. Women's Team competition

Eligibility

The IAU 24H WC are only for the athletes and the team official entered by IAU Member Federations. Only athletes and teams officially registered by their National Federation will count for the Championships teams' result. Every Country can send **9 men and 9 women** with a maximum number of officials according to team number (1-6 athletes: 3 officials, 7-12 athletes: 6 officials, 13-18 athletes: 9 officials).

For the individual results, it will only rank the performances(km) of the athletes in each delegation. For the teams' results, only 6 per team, the delegation will be ranked according to the addition of the performances(km) of their 3 best athletes in the team. During the Award Ceremony, IAU medals will be given to 6 athletes and the team leader. **Team leader must confirm the names of these 6 athletes who will be ranked in the team competition before the Technical Meeting (at the Outfit Meeting).**

7 ENTRIES - PRELIMINARY (PEF) AND FINAL (FEF) ENTRY FORMS

Preliminary Entry Form

Each Federation must send the form provided by IAU. In order to book the accommodation, each Federation will send a list with numbers of athletes, officials, and other team members.

Final Entry Form

Each Federation must send the forms provided by IAU. With the final entry form, each Federation will send the **final list** with the names of the athletes, dates of birth, sex and curriculum vitae or personal bests, and inform the LOC about the travel itinerary details of the delegation members (arrival and departure times, flight No.), the requirement about accommodation (number of rooms, number of nights, number of meals) and other special note (vegetarian...) to be provided. Also, the LOC would like to collect the photo of each athlete for promotion use so please provide the athletes' photos when sending the FEF as well.

Please note that the travel and accommodation offer made by the LOC are conditional on the prompt return of the entry forms within the deadlines.

Team-Grant are paid for maximum one male and one female team, (minimum 3 runners/team). Individual-Grant are paid for maximum 3 men and 3 women per country. All these grants are cumulative.

The Travel Grant will only be paid by **Bank Transfer** after the event.

The Provisional Travel Grant (PTG) information will be sent by email to the contact named in the PEF two weeks before the race. The provisional travel grant will need to be signed with bank details confirmed and returned to robert.boyce@iauultramarathon.org prior to the championships. At the start of the race there will be a check of the athletes who have started. If athletes who are on the PTG information, do not start the amount of TG will be changed. Final payment amounts will be made after the event from confirmed athletes who started.

Use of Wildcards

WILDCARDS mean that a runner with only a C level (or less) may be upgraded to a B-level for that particular MIAU competition. At every MIAUC a maximum of 2 wildcards (one man and one women) will be given automatically.

Chientan Youth Activity Center

This will be the central office of LOC and the ceremony venue during the championships. The Chientan Youth Activity Center is near by the Jientan station(R15) on the Red line MRT. Walk from Exit 2 for approximately 5-10 minutes.



Race Venue

This will be the race venue during the championships. The venue is near the River Evacuation Gate 10 (Lin An Tai Historical House). There are beverage vending machines (pay with cash coins) and public toilets in Riverside Park.











Chientan Youth Activity Center to Race Venue

The center is about 2 km to the race venue. Team can have a course inspection or training by walking.

Starting from the front gate of Chientan Youth Activity Center, turn right and go along the road on the right-hand sidewalk. \rightarrow Cross the Zhongshan Bridge, and there is a stair at the end of the bridge. \rightarrow Go down the stair and follow the guide signs, then enter the riverside by another stair. \rightarrow After entering the riverside, go straight along the riverside route to reach the venue.







10 ACCREDITATION

Throughout the event, the central office of the LOC will be located at the **Chientan Youth Activity Center**, the accreditation procedure will also be organized at there. The accreditation service hours depend on the arrival of the teams and will inform the team leader about the process.

National team's accreditation card will be prepared in advance of the event, based on the information provided by the Member Federation in the FEF.

Each team member will receive an accreditation card after the team arrive. The accreditation card which must be worn at all times and should be clearly visible (off-competition). LOC staff will control certain areas exit. The accreditation is not transferable and does not allow the holder to take another person beyond checkpoints. No changes will be accepted after the final entry deadline.

Any lost or damaged accreditation card should be reported to the LOC. Duplicate cards can be obtained where proof of identity can be established at a charge of USD\$30.

Please note that accreditations will only be handed out to the teams once the accommodation invoice has been fully paid by the Member Federation.

Team Leaders WhatsApp Groups

A WhatsApp group including all Member Federations' team leaders will be created for the championships, to address instant messages and announcements. Major information of interest for all will be communicated to the teams by the organizing committee via this group.





11 SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT IN WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The LOC of IAU 24h World Championship has set out to establish a new model for the world championship, pledging to deliver this more responsible and sustainable event.

Sustainability Ambition

The LOC will focus on implementing two indexes of the SDGs of the United Nations, SDG 12 - Responsible consumption and production and SDG 13 -Climate actions. During the period of organizing world championship, we will adopt 6R policy which are Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Remind, Refuse, and Replace. The actions are for the benefit of reducing the Carbon footprints and reducing the using of plastic products.

Green Partners

We invite all the participants as our Green partners. You can bring a worn running shirt (made in polyester) with you and put it into the recycle box on site. The Taiwan local textile company will recycle your running shirt and produce some new t-shirts for next championship.

The participants will have the chance to experience more green technologies in the race. Such as the power source on site is the hydrogen power provider instead of diesel fuel generator. However, we need your cooperation as well, please bring your own water cup, then we can reduce a huge amount of paper water cups. Let's have a green race together!

Passports must be valid for at least 6 months, and visitors must have a confirmed return air/sea ticket or air/sea ticket or a visa for the next destination, and a confirmed seat reservation for departure flight.

Taiwan allows visa-exempt entry for visitors intending to stay for short periods of time for certain passport holders. Categories include tourism, visiting friends or relatives, business, attending exhibitions, fact-finding, social visits, and international exchanges.

Visitors who are not eligible for visa-exempt entry may be eligible for entry via a different scheme by way of approved third country visas or may be eligible for online e-visa application. Others are required to apply for a visa at a diplomatic mission abroad. For more information, please check the above link.





14 TRAVEL & TRANSPORTATION

Taipei is served by two airports:

Taiwan Taoyuan International Airport (TPE)

This is the main airport in Taiwan. Its majority served for most of the international flights. Buses or MRT to Taipei and the HSR shuttle bus direction can be found inside the terminals. https://www.taoyuan-airport.com/?lang=en

The TPE airport is located 40km away from accommodation and the venue. The road distance can be covered in about 1 hours by driving.

Taipei Songshan Airport (TSA)

This airport is in Taipei city. It scheduled flights serving domestically in Taiwan, and to some cities in East Asia. MRT Station (BR13) and Taxi can be found outside the terminals.

The TSA airport is located 7km away from accommodation and the venue. The road distance can be covered in about 20 mins by driving.

Transfers From and To Airport

Travel to and from the airport will be arranged at no extra cost for those staying at the official accommodation for the race and the booking will be made while submitting the FEF. Teams should meet the LOC staff who will be waiting for them at the arrival area of the airport. The returning transportation to airport after race will be arranged about 3 hours before the airplane takes off. The transportation schedule will be given out after the arrival.

Thursday, November 30 at 13:30-14:30, Chientan Youth Activity Center Conference Room. This meeting is mandatory for all delegations. Team leaders need to present their national uniforms for inspection, and to confirm the athletes who are competing and be ranked.

The bibs and the chips will distribute at the meeting. There are 4 bib numbers and 2 systems of timing chips provided. The first timing chip is on the back of bib number tags. The second chip should be tied on the shoe or strap to the ankle, and the team leader is responsible for collecting the chips from athletes after the race and returning as a team at the certificate pick-up area.

18 MEDICAL & INSURANCE

Physiotherapy Services

Physiotherapists will be at the competition venue during the race. There will be an open area at the venue for medical treatments. The service time will be announced on site.

Medical

The safety and welfare of competitors is of paramount importance to the Medical Team. In accordance with rule 53.1 of the WA Competition Rules, each Federation agrees to submit the following information surrounding its runners:

- a. Any medical history and/or pathology in particular those which may increase their risk during exercise.
- b. The regular use of treatments and medicines in the 15 days leading up to the race.
- c. All requests form of use of medicines subject to a Therapeutic Usage Exemption (TUE).
- d. Accept to answer any request the Medical Team may make based on the information submitted in order to discuss the runner's ability or not to participate in the competition.
- e. Accept that, under rule 144 of the WA Competition Rules, the Medical Team decision on participation before or during the race is final.
- f. Any RTPCR/Vaccination Report will be as stipulated by the local government.

Insurance

The LOC provide public liability insurance and medical cover for the race on site. Participating Member Federation are responsible for taking out their own insurance to cover the risk of illness or injury of any member of their team when travelling to and from 2023 IAU 24H World Championships and during the event itself. Please take necessary steps to fulfil these requirements well in advance.

A person who registers on the website or submits the entry form with the team means that he/she agrees and consents to accept medical treatment from the LOC or their medical personnel in the event that he/she is injured or otherwise becomes ill or incapacitated during the Championships. In the event of any emergency medical treatment or services provided to the person requiring the payment of fees, he/she agrees to pay these fees upon request.

Doping Controls

The Anti-Doping Regulations of the World Anti-Doping Code of the World Anti-Doping Agency will be applied. Post-competition doping controls will be carried out in accordance with the WA Rules and by the Taiwan Anti-Doping Association (TADA).

Teams who need a doping control (at their cost about USD\$610) for the ratification of a national record have to indicate it in the FEF.

Team leader might like to keep a copy of athletes' passport for identification if asked by an official or if the athlete of the team is chosen for a doping test.





19 OPEN RACE

In addition to the athletes of the IAU and WMA Championships, there will be a limited number of runners allowed to take part in the competition. Runners wishing to enter should

- a. register via the LOC website: https://bao-ming.com/eb/content/5753#reg before **October 16, 2023** or sold out.
- b. provides the proof of an achievement of a minimum of 150km within the past 4 years for both man and woman; the proof can be athlete's DUV page link (DUV: https://statistik.d-u-v.org/).
- c. pays an entry fee of USD\$170.

The LOC will finalise and announced the list of the accepted participants.

Open Race - Registration Pack Distribution

To proceed the distribution procedure, open race participants please present the passport. The registration pack will include total of 4 bib numbers for each athlete, pins, timing IC chip, and other information and souvenir the LOC will provide.

There will be 2 systems of timing chips provided. The first timing chip is on the back of bib number tags. The second chip should be tied on the shoe or strap to the ankle, and this chip should be returned after the race at the certificate pick-up area with a deposit refunded.

Overseas runners

Registration Pack can be pick-up as follows:

November 30, 2023, 13:30-15:30 at the conference room at the Chientan Center.

December 1, 2023, 08:00-09:00 at the race venue service tent.

Domestic runners

Registration Pack will be sent out a week before the race date to the register domestic address. Those who register after October 16, 2023 will have to pick-up the bib at the race venue service tent on December 1, 2023 from 08:00-09:00.

Open Race - Award

There are no age or team award of the open race. Awards will be given for first, second and third place individuals. Awards for open race will be given out at the race site about 1 hour after the race finished.

Special Award

The open race runner who can run above IAU international level will receive a golden statuette as special award, the runner who can run above the IAU national level will receive a silver statuette and the runner run over 180K can receive a bronze statuette.

The runners should visit the service tent – referee crew and retrieve the statuette after the race results have been posted on the website. No postal service will be provided.

Taipei is the capital city of Taiwan. Taipei is a place that foreigners can get around easily. Taipei is home to various world-famous architectural or cultural landmarks which include Taipei 101, Chiang Kai-shek Memorial Hall, Dalongdong Baoan Temple, Hsing Tian Kong, Lungshan Temple of Manka, National Palace Museum, Presidential Office Building, Taipei Guest House, Ximending, and several night markets dispersing over the city. Its natural features such as Maokong, Yangmingshan, and Beitou hot springs are also well known to international visitors.



Money Issues


The currency of Taiwan is the new Taiwan Dollar (NTD\$). Foreign currencies can be exchanged at airport, government-designated banks and some hotels front desk. Receipts are given when currency is exchanged, and must be presented in order to exchange unused NT dollars before departure.

Cash is more widely accepted in the street snack bars; and the credit cards are accepted in the shops or restaurants. Most of local stores do not receive Traveler's Check, therefore travelers who have Traveler's Check, please exchange for NT dollars.

Hotels and restaurants in Taiwan often charge a 10% service fee included. Even though tipping is not mandatory, the service staff greatly appreciate if you tip them for their good service.

Electricity

Taiwan uses electric current of 110 volts at 60 cycles, appliances from Europe, Australia or South-East Asia will need an adaptor or transformer. Many buildings have sockets with 220 volts especially for the use of air conditioners.



Getting Around

To get around in the city, you can take advantage of the bus or MRT system. Get a copy of the local tour guide or bus / MRT book, it can tell how to get where you want to go. If you are planning on traveling for longer distance, the High-speed Railway or railroad system should be handy.

Bus/MRT/Taxi

The MRT system is popular in Taipei, and they are neat and convenient. You can easily transfer between MRT and buses to most scenic spots.

There is lots of Taxi in Taipei city; there is a fixed price system by distance. Uber service is popular as well in Taipei.
